The Power of Parent Partnership at Fravashi International Academy -

At Fravashi International Academy, we believe that education is a collaborative journey between the school and families. On an average, from Early Years to Grade 12, a student spends approximately 33% of their time at school (under strict monitoring), leaving 67% of their time outside the school environment—a space heavily influenced by family, peers, and digital exposure— which needs a detailed monitoring by parents. To state the basics, a parent must at all times know the whereabouts (exact location, activities he/she indulges in) of his own child much before they get to know about it from anybody else.

As parents, it is natural to assume that we understand our children well. However, in today's fast-paced, digitally-driven world, where external influences shape a child's personality as much as internal values do, it is essential to pause and reflect. Do we truly know our children beyond their academic achievements? If we don't, then there is a need to spend quality time with children every single day. Strong communication is the key that would make children comfortably share their joys, concerns, aspirations, strengths, weaknesses, likes, dislikes, anger, threats, and so much more with parents. Accordingly, parents can make the most of this 'quality time' to work towards raising well-rounded individuals who are equipped to navigate an increasingly dynamic world.

As rightly said, parenting does not come with a manual. But, with some tips, tricks and shared experiences parenting can be smoother. Being an educator, and a guardian to all my children studying at Fravashi Schools, I want to make an earnest request to my Parent Partners to follow 3 simple guidelines curated in the best interest of our children so that we focus on making them ready for Life instead of making them ready for a day -

1. Stop Protecting Children From Problems

As Parents, it is but natural to extend all support and help to your child in finding solutions to their problems. Ever imagined a day where you would not be there to guide them? What will your child do at that time? Please understand that it is important for children to be independent right from the Pre-primary age. 2. Allow Children To Go Through Failures -

Let children feel their own struggles and problems, these things will make our children stronger. As parents, be there with them during these times, guide them, encourage them, pray for them, and express your love and affection to them. A fast-changing world can be easily adapted to by stronger individuals. Children who face failures on their own, learn to come out of them stronger, braver and more confident. Again, there is no right age for this, the sooner you start, the stronger your children will be at a young age. In order to imbibe the 'never give up attitude' in our children, it is a must for them to face hardships, failures, struggles thereby overcoming them, on their own!



3. Praise Their Effort, Not Their Talent -

No matter what grades/marks/children score, their effort must always be appreciated. As parents, speak to them about the hard work that you saw them doing, guide them with what can be done for a better performance in the future, and encourage them to put in their best for the next time. Children will be very happy if their effort is recognised by the parents without bothering about their results. I am sure with this kind of a motivation from parents, all our children will definitely reach greater heights.

With the above guidelines followed, I am sure every parent would be happy to see their children becoming independent, and becoming more-and-more ready to conquer the world full of challenges.

I am sure, as responsible parents, a strict monitoring of the children's screen-time is being followed so that the 67% of the time that they are away from school is used productively. In today's world where technology is replacing multiple traditional tools, and the fact that even toddlers are able to operate screen on their own, it is crucial for parents to be a step ahead. With technology coming with its own pros and cons, there are multiple applications that are extremely parent-friendly, helping parents minimise the children's screen time using an in-built timer, as well as gaining control of every little thing that children would do using the screen. 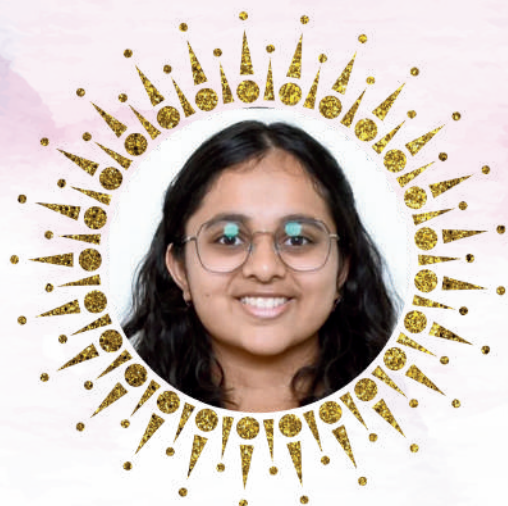

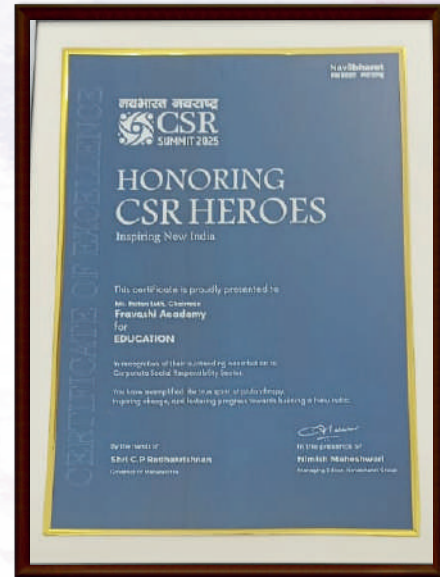

She collaborated with local hospitals to organise CPR workshops, first aid training and roadside trauma assistance, reaching over 5,000 people in 15 months – from school children to factory workers. Introducing the concept of 'health messengers', Tanishka trained two representatives in each village to address emergencies like cardiac arrests and natural disasters. Her efforts also include annual blood donation camps and fundraising to install defibrillators in village panchayats, ensuring swift medical assistance in remote areas
