#### There Are No Back Benchers at Fravashi

A recent viral post from Kerala showcased classrooms breaking away from traditional seating-rows replaced with circles, benches replaced with collaborative clusters. Interestingly, this movement was inspired by the Malayalam movie "Manjummel Boys", a film that unexpectedly set off a conversation around inclusion and visibility within classrooms. While this progressive change is being welcomed across the country, at Fravashi International Academy, we couldn't help but reflect: We've always believed in this. At Fravashi, there are no back benchers—because there are no back benches.

#### A Classroom Without Corners

From our Early Years classrooms to Middle School learning spaces, the layout is designed with intention. Seating arrangements are flexible, collaborative, and inclusive. Clusters of four, round table groupings, floor seating, and activity corners ensure that every child is seen, heard, and engaged. There is no front or back in our classrooms—only circles of curiosity, semicircles of discussion, and small groups that foster peer learning. The layout isn't just aesthetic. It's pedagogical. Multiple international studies—such as those from the Harvard Graduate School of Education—highlight that students' neural activity improves with movement, variation in physical space, and proximity to peers and teachers. In simpler terms: when children move, their minds move too.

#### Learning Spaces That Breathe

For our senior learners, it's not just about academic rigour—it's about academic relevance. Discussion rooms, open classrooms, AV-integrated learning zones, and outdoor breakout areas replace the theatre-style, passive listening models of the past. Here, students don't just take notes; they take ownership. And it's not just the seating-it's the setting. Fravashi International Academy is environmentally conscious by design. Natural sunlight floods every room. Wide corridors and cross-ventilated classrooms ensure fresh air is not a luxury, but a constant. With lush greenery and clean pathways, the campus breathes so the children can too. Hygiene and cleanliness are non-negotiable priorities-making the campus not just beautiful, but safe. In a world where children often grow up surrounded by concrete, pollution, and artificial lights, our school provides a living, breathing environment. Because we believe the environment is the third teacher—equally influential as the facilitator and the learning resource.

#### Benches Exist-Back Benches Don't

Let's be clear, we do have benches. But not to sort children into front-row achievers and forgotten corners. At Fravashi, every seat is a front-row seat. Every child is in the spotlight.

The traditional 'backbencher' label, a stereotype loaded with judgement and assumption—has no place here. We don't believe a child who chooses the far corner is disengaged. Instead, we ask what can we change in the space, the method, or the moment to help them thrive? Our teachers are trained to observe without bias, facilitate with purpose, and move through the room, connecting with every learner. Because teaching is not delivery-it's dialogue. And dialogue needs proximity.

#### Freedom to Move, Freedom to Learn

Movement improves cognitive performance, enhances memory recall, and reduces anxiety. When students change posture, change partners, or simply shift their view, their brains re-engage. Our classrooms are designed to allow that rhythm-learning is not static, so why should seating be?

#### A Legacy of Learning That Evolves

We're proud that mainstream institutions are beginning to rethink classroom architecture. But for us at Fravashi, this has always been a part of who we are. For over two decades, our legacy has never been in how many classrooms we built—but in how we built each one with the learner at the centre. At Frayashi, there are no back benchers, Only forward learners,

### Scholarly Niche

I had always wanted to attend an astrophotography workshop—and this one lived up to all my expectations. Early one morning, I set off with my dad from home and reached the meeting point in Pune by afternoon. From there, our group of sixteen packed the equipment into the cars and began a four-hour journey to a remote dark-sky site.

I had brought along my trusty DSLR, three lenses—a wide field, a medium zoom, and a big telephoto—plus a tripod and my laptop. Just packing everything was a mission in itself. Balancing my essentials with all the bulky gear made it feel like I was preparing for a small expedition.

During the drive, I got to know the other participants. Most were professionals—one was even a surgeon—and only two of us were still in school. We exchanged tips, talked about photography techniques, and bonded over our shared passion for the night sky.



Once we arrived, we began setting up. The organizers had brought along some impressive equipment, including massive telescopes and high-end equatorial mounts. As the sun dipped below the horizon, we aligned our gear and ran final checks. Then the sky darkened—and the real excitement began.

We were split into two groups: one focused on wide-field photography, the other on deep-sky objects (DSOs). Unfortunately, clouds rolled in soon after, blocking most of the sky. Disappointed, we eventually turned in for the night, resting in some very basic accommodation.

The next day brought better luck. After a short morning trek into the valley below our site, the organizers held a session on post-processing astrophotos. That evening, conditions improved. With a star tracker now added to my setup, I managed to capture the Lagoon and Trifid Nebulae, the Orion constellation, the North America Nebula, and the breathtaking arc of the Milky Way. Watching that glowing band stretch across the sky was a surreal experience.

By 5 a.m., I packed up my gear and caught a few hours of sleep before we began the return trip. We left at 8 a.m., had a light breakfast, and reached Pune, where my uncle picked me up. After lunch at his place, he dropped me off at the State Transport bus station.

This was my first time traveling alone on an intercity public bus, so I was a bit anxious—but everything went smoothly. I reached Nashik by 8 p.m., where my parents were waiting to take me home.
